the interconnectedness of the figure and the landscape. Patrice draws upon plein air studies of wild Australian landscapes that


become inseparable from the reality of being human.



Maqbool Ahmed

is a master at sensitively portraying the personal struggles of women, by setting them amidst surreal, dream-like sequences which slice through their socio-cultural dilemmas, creating a clash of their dreams and aspirations with the reality of suppressed lives. Women characters are soft, feminine; lightly dressed and faceless forms show their



vulnerability, yet these women are aware that these feelings are mere reflections in a mirror - portraying its unrealised or unacknowledged status.

The casually elegant faceless female characters make statements through their silence, engaging viewers in a dialogue. The women in these paintings are connected with each other in an unseen thread, a deep feeling which only they share.

Maqbool Ahmed has created a visual storyboard of female existentialism by capturing the emotional upheavals of women. Through brilliance of colours, light and shade, Ahmed transforms the canvas to a translucent and transparent quality.

Soft feminine forms depict varied strains of female sensibilities and the existential struggles engulfing the lives of women. These are luminous, delicate pieces with a universal appeal. Each painting has a detained composition harmonious to the reflections and refractions of the artist's thoughts.

Syed A Irfan is a self-taught artist. He was born on 26th May, 1985 in Karachi. He developed the passion of miniature painting, when he visited with his family at Lahore Museum in 1997. There he saw miniature paintings and started trying miniature art with the help of miniature art books and the internet.

At the age of 17, he for the very first time showed his art piece to the owner of Zenaini Art Gallery, Ms. Saira. She couldn't believe her eyes. She was really impressed by his work and supported him and included him in the group exhibition in the year 2003 which was his first exhibition in Zenaini Art Gallery with other senior miniaturists.

Irfan has arranged many group and solo exhibitions in different countries of the world like Pakistan, USA, Dubai, Turkey, Canada, London, Saudi Arab and India, etc. He has done three solo and above 50 group exhibitions in different countries. Mughal Traditional Miniature has actually become his identity. Furthermore, he has also done Orientalism and Contemporary style miniature work.

Seeing his great talent he'd been awarded by PTV the Best Performance Award in 2007. He won a Special Prize in Sadequain Award Exhibition in 2006, and in 2001 he got first prize in All Degree College Art Exhibition.


His family is really very supporting and his parents are so proud of him. His work has been displayed permanently in some of the countries worldwide.







Azlin Ali



In 2020. The C.A.T. group came runners up in the Casula isolation competition. The C.A.T installation was also included in the Ryde SWAP sustainable art exhibition.


